Women's Corrections Report: (Cari L)

-Tue. and Wed. meetings have 12-15 attendees. -Cari discussed the previous issue with Jim from Hilltop regarding the donated Grapevines not making it to inmates. They will be hand delivered moving forward. The Grapevine is extending the subscription by a few months to account for the editions that did not make it to the inmates. -Cari will be attending school starting in January, but has a new volunteer that will be ready before then. -The women have

been requesting full edition Big Books for the stories. Dover donated 2 boxes of 4th editions to women's corrections. -Corrections is accepting donations if any other groups would like to contribute. -Counselors were distributing the provided literature through the Freedom Program. PI collectively determined that the Freedom Program can provide their own literature. -Will be advising inmates at the meetings that they can request AA literature from their counselors.

-**Motion** passed to stop AA donated literature from being provided through the Freedom Program and for the literature to be provided directly to the inmates through their counselors.

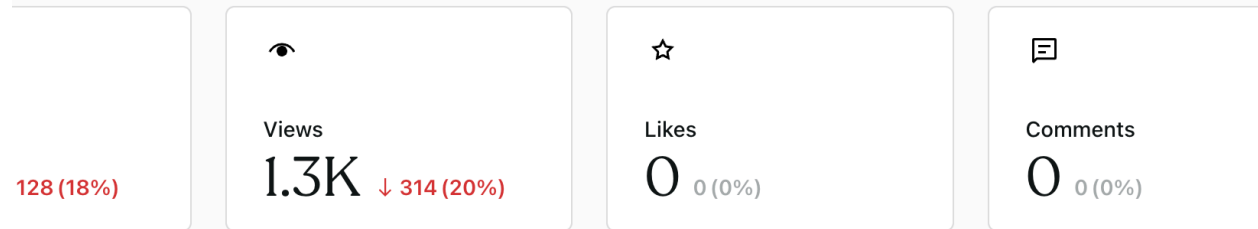

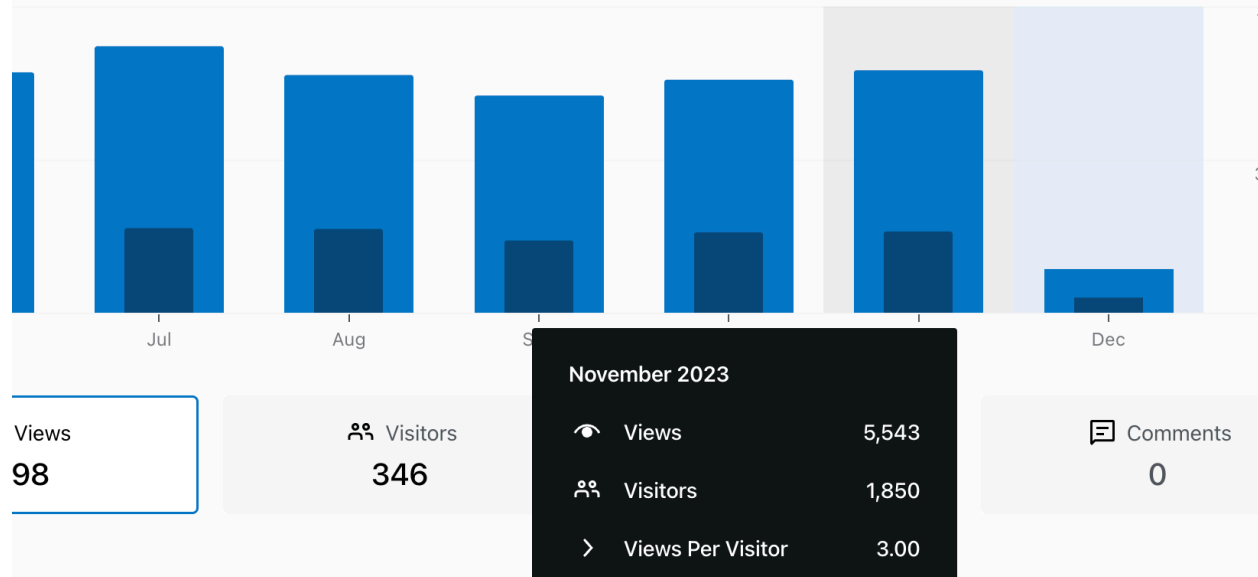
